

THEME:

God's Affection Toward Us > Philippians 1:8

CONVERSATION:

- 1. Have you ever gone to ridiculous lengths just to be in the vicinity or presence of someone famous?
 - a. Why does it matter so much to us to be in the *physical* presence of someone we think important?
 - b. Why not be satisfied to just see them on TV or at a distance?
- 2. Tell a story about a time when someone did something significant for or to be with you that showed you how much they care.
 - a. What was it about what they did that meant so much to you?
- 3. If you think about your day-today attitude toward God, which of the following do you think is a more accurate description?:
 - a. I have made/make more effort to "get to" [or get the attention of] God
 - b. **God** has made/makes more effort to be with [or even just get the attention of] me
 - i. Why do you see it that way? Whether or not you said "b," if that dynamic was/is the true one, what effect would this knowledge have on your life?
- 4. Check out Philippians 4:4 >

Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!

And Romans 8:38-39 (MSG)>

[Nothing] fazes us <u>because Jesus loves us</u>. I'm absolutely convinced that nothing—nothing living or dead, angelic or demonic, today or tomorrow, high or low, thinkable or unthinkable—absolutely nothing can get between us and God's love because of the way that Jesus our Master has embraced us.

- a. Based on the description of God's love for us in Romans, is Paul's command to "rejoice always" unreasonable?
 - i. How does [would] knowing this [Christ's affection toward you] naturally incite joy?

RESPOND:

How can you apply these verses above >> that is, what **specific things** currently on your mind or upcoming can you release and rejoice in (or in spite of) "because Jesus loves us"?
